Founded in 1965, the Kansas Learning Center for Health (KLCH) continues to be the only health education center located in Kansas, and the nation's second oldest health education museum.

For 52 years, the Learning Center has hosted well over a half million visitors of all ages. KLCH offers a newly renovated full-service museum including hands-on exhibits, 17 health education programs, a 68-person auditorium and Valeda, a transparent anatomical mannequin.

The Hertzler Research Foundation, now KLCH, was created by Dr. Irene Koeneke as a memorial to her husband, Dr. Arthur E. Hertzler, where his legacy and spirit lives on today. Dr. Hertzler, the famous Horse and Buggy Doctor, was world renowned for his excellence in pathology, his love of children, and his concern for health education of the public.

The Kansas Learning Center for Health Fund enhances the Center through hands-on exhibits and programs that promote the well-being of individuals and their communities through encouragement of healthy lifestyles, behaviors and environments.
